## Eagle Mountain - Woodfibre Gas Pipeline project update

Dear neighbour,

FortisBC is planning to expand a portion of our existing Vancouver Island transmission system to supply Woodfibre LNG's planned facility near Squamish. This includes installing 50 kilometers of new gas line between Squamish and Coquitlam, as well as building supporting infrastructure such as compressor stations. We are committed to building and operating the Eagle Mountain - Woodfibre Gas Pipeline safely and reliably, working in an environmentally responsible manner, and meaningful engagement with local and Indigenous communities.

## Work planned for your area

We are proposing to build a workforce accommodation lodge, and site office and laydown yard on the Mamquam River Forest Service Road as part of this project. These will allow us to complete work safely and as quickly as possible, while minimizing impacts to the Squamish community and the environment. The attached map contains the preferred locations for these facilities. Both sites are on privately owned land.

We always strive to be a good neighbour in the communities that we serve. You're invited to join us at a neighborhood information session to learn more about these plans, ask questions and provide feedback.
